

North-South Encounters

The first CIVIS School "North-South Encounters" is organised by the ICGSS at the University of Tübingen in collaboration with the CIVIS partner universities as well as partner institutions in the Global South such as UNAM (Mexico City), UFF (Rio de Janeiro / Niterói) and UCAD (Dakar). The aim is to introduce postgraduate students and young scholars from the humanities and social sciences to current research discussions, theories and methods in the field of Global South Studies, Latin American and African Studies. In this context, we engage with North-South relations as well as their conflictive history and present.

Thematic axes

This year's virtual edition of the Summer School will focus on Atlantic relations between Europe, Africa and Latin America in the context of the current day revision of the history of slavery and coloniality against the backdrop of the Black Lives Matter movement. The thematic axes of the programme include temporalities and memories, the legacy of slavery, racism in audiovisual media, BlackLivesMatter in the public space. In addition to academic lectures and workshops, the CIVIS Summer school offers encounters with practitioners from the UNESCO Heritage Programme "The Route of the Slave" and from Afro-Colombian cinema. Furthermore, the Summer School offers an insight into African and Latin American studies at the participating universities.

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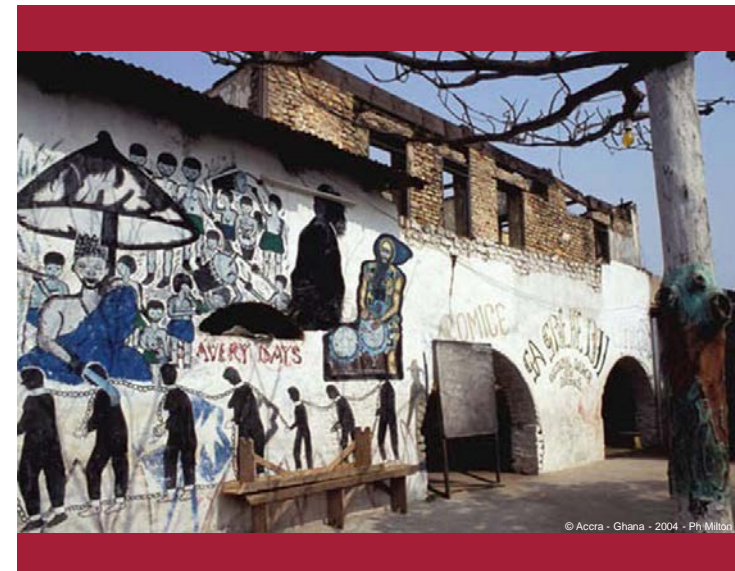
